Justice

The most important provisions of SB91, the 2016 Alaska criminal justice revision passed with bipartisan legislative support, only got funding applied for these provisions starting Jan. 1, 2018, when "2,231 unsentenced men and women were being held behind bars," per this ktuu report. The law mandated use of a pretrial assessment tool (to comply with our state constitution) and created "the \$10.2 million Pretrial Enforcement Division of the Alaska Dept of Corrections. ... 60 new pretrial officers, & others trained for that duty in local police depts & parole offices, are charged with monitoring defendants released before trial." According to the latest Pentagon report, there are now more than 20 terrorist groups in Afghanistan and Pakistan. Rather than quell terrorist activity, U.S. counterterrorism seems to link to exactly the opposite, fomenting insurgent recruitment in Africa and the Middle East. ..." from <http://vietnamfulldisclosure.org> 1-26-18 : "Vietnam, US begin Agent Orange cleanup at former wartime air base ... some spots at the airport had the highest levels of dioxin contamination in the world, at 1.18 million parts per trillion (ppt)... 100ppt is considered high..... 1961-1971, the US Army sprayed some 80 million liters of Agent Orange over 30,000 square miles of southern Vietnam. Dioxin, a highly toxic chemical contained in the defoliant, stays in the soil and at the bottom of lakes and rivers for generations. It can enter the food chain through meat, fish & other animals, and has been found at alarmingly high levels in human breast milk.

Between 2.1 to 4.8 million Vietnamese were directly exposed to Agent Orange & other chemicals that have been linked to cancers, birth defects and other chronic diseases before the war ended in April 1975, according to the Vietnam Red Cross." [Read the rest of the article.](#)
