Offshore Drilling- Wednesday the Department of Interior announced it is publishing in the Federal Register a call for information and nominations covering a proposed lease sale in Alaska’s Beaufort Sea Planning Area in 2019, a move that threatens to expedite oil and gas exploration in this culturally and environmentally sensitive area. This announcement comes prior to the finalization of the 5 -year plan for outer continental shelf drilling. This action ignores

from *Northern Alaska Environmental Center*: “The Bureau of Ocean Energy Management announced a **Call for Information and Nominations** for **leasing in the Beaufort Sea... despite widespread opposition** in Alaska and around the country to the proposal to open nearly all U.S. coastal areas to drilling, and the recent ruling that the lawsuit filed **against the federal government's reversal of the Obama-era withdrawals will be allowed to move forward**. The call is for a 2019 lease sale for an area currently off limits, and the 5-year plan which includes this area is not yet finalized.

In a statement, Adrienne Titus of Native Movement said, “Rushing ocean lease sales in the Arctic is opening a threatening door of destruction to Alaska Native culture and food security. As an Inupiaq woman I oppose this threat to our future, the future of all Alaskans and all life on this planet. Opening the oceans to oil development would eliminate the chance of my grandchildren truly knowing who I am.”

Along with our partner organizations, we issued a statement saying “(T)his Beaufort sale is about giving a win to the Alaska delegation by starting the process to fast-track getting leases into the hands of the oil industry without full, fair and open debate. It’s clear that Trump’s offshore process is driven purely by politics, and is not in the best interest of Americans.”

This announcement marked the start of a brief 30-day comment period for industry and interested parties on "particular geological, environmental, biological, archaeological and socioeconomic conditions, use conflicts, or other information that could affect the potential leasing and development of particular areas." **Comment online by April 30 here**.
