Sidestepping respectful, peaceful mediation among the divided citizenry can easily result in more human suffering, violence, and instability. The state Division of Elections tracked the status of registered Alaska voters and sent out notices to those who had not voted recently. The notices warn people who haven’t been voting that they have until February 28 to contact the Elections Division before being deactivated. Once a voter is deemed “inactivated,” future ballots will be put in “questioned” status and have to be reviewed before being counted. CODEPINK 2/4: No US intervention in Venezuela

The U.S. has a long and sordid history of supporting coups in Latin America — Guatemala in 1953, Chile in 1973, Honduras in 2009 — and it always turned out disastrous for the people. It's urgent that you speak out against the current policy of regime change, including the possibility of military intervention.

U.S. economic sanctions have devastated Venezuela's economy, exacerbating food and medicine shortages, widespread poverty, and mass migration. The people of Venezuela need sanctions to be lifted and dialogue between the Maduro government and the opposition. Mexico and Uruguay have offered to mediate, as has the Pope. A democratic process, not a coup, should be supported.

As your constituent, I ask you to add your name to the Ro Khanna and Pramila Jayapal Dear Colleague letter to Mike Pompeo (current signers are Khanna, Jayapal, Grijalva, Omar, and Hank Johnson) addressing the harm US sanctions are having on the Venezuelan people and the need for dialogue facilitated by Mexico, Uruguay, and the Pope.

Please also become an original co-sponsor of Representative David Cicilline's legislation, making it clear to President Trump that without congressional authorization, military force may not be used in Venezuela. After becoming an original co-sponsor of the legislation, please encourage revision of the legislation's over the top "horror of the Maduro regime" language. It should be toned down and revised to be similar to the Khanna-Jayapal letter, which contains very important language on the harm being done to the Venezuelan people by the sanctions and the need for dialogue to move forward to solve this crisis peacefully.

Under a 1924 law, the House Ways and Means Committee can examine any Americans' tax returns. The law was inspired by financial conflicts of interest from then-Treasury Secretary Andrew Mellon.

From there, lawmakers on the committee can vote to make the person's tax returns public. Importantly, the committee on its own can vote to do so, meaning it wouldn't have to pass the Republican-controlled Senate. *from GovTrack.us*

The Fairbanks Native Association (FNA) has agreed to provide substance abuse treatment services for this project. Now the agencies are looking for other partnering services (employment services, childcare, health advocacy, mental health services, and many more) to round out this project. The goal is to create an environment for victims of domestic violence to regain their independence. "As reported in Black Agenda Report, "**HR 1 pretends to be a voting rights bill**, but is...intended to rebrand Democrats as the party of voting rights, despite their dismal non-record of struggle to protect or expand these rights."

"The proposed bill, which has not been introduced as of yet, will create a huge barrier for smaller parties like the Green Party from fielding a Presidential candidate because it "...quintuples the amount Green presidential campaigns are required to raise to qualify for federal matching funds from \$5,000 in each of 20 states by the last day of 2019, to \$25,000 per state in 20 states, and the deadline falls at the end of this very year."
