The 14-inch diameter pipeline would originate 7.7 miles north of the Beluga Power Plant and terminate at the Donlin Gold mine site, approximately 10 miles north of the community of Crooked Creek. Of the proposed 315-mile-long pipeline, approximately 207 miles would be located on State of Alaska owned lands. The proposed pipeline would have a maximum operating pressure of 1,480 pounds per square inch gauge and be buried for most the route. The operating pipeline right-of-way lease would include one compressor station and one metering station. Donlin has requested a 150-foot-wide right-of-way for pipeline construction and a 50-foot-wide right-of-way for operations. Additionally, the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is proposing to close the lands within the proposed ROW, plus 100 feet on either side, to mineral entry for the protection of the pipeline. The mineral order would take effect upon issuance of the ROW lease and end upon the expiration or termination of the lease. The order would potentially affect up to 14,706 acres of State-owned lands, reducing to roughly 6,250 acres after construction. Alaska House Bill 82 to extend equal rights and legal protections for LGBTQ people statewide was introduced Wednesday by Anchorage Rep. Andy Josephson, and quickly co-sponsored by Fbks Rep. Grier Hopkins. It is already unlawful to discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, age, physical or mental disability, marital status or changes in such status, or status as a veteran or disabled veteran. *per FDNM 3-8-19*

A related issue is the U.S. proposed **Equal Rights Amendment** that introduced in Congress in 1972 and was supposed to prevent government discrimination on the basis of gender. Alaska ratified it within a month, but it still lacks ratification by a 38th state to become law. AK Sen. Lisa Murkowski and MD Sen. Ben Cardin ' have a [new bill](#) that would lift the deadline while proponents work to get one more state to sign on.' *per KTOO 1-29-19*

This past Friday US district judge Claude Hilton held Chelsea Manning, probably the most important U.S. whistle blower since Daniel Ellsberg published the Pentagon Papers, in contempt for refusing to testify before a Grand Jury. Stating that she had no intention of testifying, Chelsea told the Judge Hilton “I will accept whatever you bring upon me.” I was privileged to attend the first day of Chelsea’s Court Martial, when in official testimony she revealed her gender identity and the feminine conscience that moved her to publish files revealing U.S. war crimes. I was blessed then to have the opportunity to thank her for her courage. I only wish that those who claim to represent us in the halls of governance had a fraction of her conscience and courage. In my first selection David Rovics sings, a “*Song for Chelsea Manning*”

My favorite quote of all times goes, “Your honor, years ago I learned my kinship to all living things, I learned then as I know now that I am not one bit better than the meanest on earth. As long as there is an underclass I am in it. As long as there is a criminal element, I am of it. As long as there is a soul in jail, I am not free. Eugene Debs, Sep. 18, 1918. So as a rule I do not support the prison industrial system aka US Justice. But I have to admit that I smile when I hear David Rovics sing the following tune concerning Iceland’s answer to the banking crises, “*Iceland Told the Bankers*”

In the next tune John Prine reminds us, “*Your Flag Decal Won’t Get You Into Heaven Anymore*”

During a nonviolence training that I took part in a few years ago, I had the honor to partner with another trainee who happened to be a veteran of the 1961 Freedom Rides across the South. He told me that at one stop a very angry white man held a large knife to his chest. He told the man, who was nearly frothing at the mouth with hate, “You may run that knife into me but you should know that when my last drop of blood hits the floor I will still love you. Admitting to having then peed his pants, he explained that he learned the power of nonviolence when his assailant dropped his knife to the floor, and then walked away.
