Enei and Aakaluk are two powerful women with powerful messages that we as a community need to hear and share. Enei will be speaking of and for Native Movement and their ongoing projects of justice and decolonization. Aakaluk speaks from the heart of the horrors and heartbreak of murdered and missing indigenous women and children. Listen to her message, and then share it. We can be part of the healing.

Finally, I'll close this weeks segment with a tune; Nikki Shawana will sign Sister Round Dance Song (Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women's Honor Song).
