from *Divest from the War Machine Digest*: “Last year, around half of what Congress allocated to the Pentagon went straight to military contractors. That equaled more than \$350 billion. Those same companies turned around and spent millions to support campaigns. The top 5 military contractors’ CEOs collectively pulled in \$96 million last year, while food programs for the hungry are being slashed. Congress won’t even talk about gun control, because the NRA spends millions on campaign contributions. It’s time to say no! Defend our communities and make policy based on what is right, not on who gives you the most money. 1. Check your trees for signs and symptoms of spruce beetle attack: Boring dust, [Pitch tubes](#), needle color change, exit holes [See www.alaskasprucebeetle.org.]
2. Remove and process actively infested trees or dead trees that may become health and safety hazards: may include debarking, chipping, or cutting and splitting for firewood
3. Make plans for spring spruce beetle management activities ”

-- *[We listened to] the indefatigable defender of human rights, Buffy Sainte Marie, singing “The War Racket”.*

*Hello this is Rob Mulford the Asymmetric Moose with picks for the week of October 6th, 2019. Today we'll be speaking of **The Racket**. I'll start where I left off two weeks ago by reading Chapter 2 from twice Congressional Medal of Honor winner, Marine Corps Major General Smedley Darlington Butler's 1936 speech “**War Is a Racket**”....*

What does the racket look like today, in the Fairbanks North Star Borough? A glimpse, of this racket, can be caught by reading a blurb that was carried on the Borough's and the Chamber of Commerce's websites advertising a conference held October 3rd and 4th at the Westmark Hotel:

*Alaska “**Defense**” Forum hosted by FNSB & Association of Defense Communities (ADC), “... will provide state and local leaders with strategies they can use to build strong military-community partnerships and rally new defense community champions at the state and local level... ADC unites the diverse interests of communities, state governments, the private sector and the military on issues of base closure and realignment, **community military partnerships**, defense real estate, mission growth, **mission sustainment**, **military privatization**, and base redevelopment.”*

*Recognizing that the so-called elected in our Borough government, having won their station by garnishing a majority of votes from sixteen percent of the electorate, have little behooving them to actually serve the interests and concerns of the plebs in their community, I decided that it **behooved me** to make my concerns known directly, instead of waiting to deliver them to the Assembly in a strictly controlled three minute sound bite that they would ignore anyway in favor of the wishes of the capitalists and militarists that lobbied them at the so-called forum.*

*My method of choice being street theater, I wore a sandwich board proclaiming on the front side, “**GET THE WAR RACKET OUT OF FAIRBANKS**”, with “**WARFIGHTER – WANT OUT? Call: 877-447-4487**”, (the GI Rights Hotline) emblazoned on the back; carried a Veterans For Peace flag and danced to Buffy Sainte Marie, singing, “**The War Racket**”, out of a small but powerful speaker mounted to my flagpole.*

When a former Borough Mayor known for his efforts to get a killer drone base built at the end of Johnson Road in Salcha – Thanks Salchans, for helping squelch that effort. – I addressed him saying, “Well if it ain't the old warmonger Mayor _____”.

He replied, “I hope you stay warm.” A couple of minutes later the hotel manager was telling me that I had to leave the property. I disagreed; my speaker playing..... as the police handcuffed my limp prostrate body.”
