Congress declared November 11 a holiday in 1938, "...a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be hereafter celebrated and known as 'Armistice Day'." On June 1, 1954, Congress amended the Act of 1938 by deleting the word "Armistice" and inserting the word "Veterans". We have been embroiled in war since. But, this does not need to continue. We *can* build a new world, beyond war, with peace and justice for all, while still respecting those who gave the highest sacrifice.
