"Nushagak Cooperative, a [Bristol Bay] **regional utility co-op, wants to harness [Nuyakuk Falls] force**, moving the region away from diesel fuel and toward clean, renewable energy, which could also lower high energy costs for its members. It has identified Nuyakuk Falls as an ideal location for a hydroelectric generator. Now it's beginning the federal permitting process in earnest... Its model would divert up to 30% of the river's flow through a generator and return it to the river... But Nuyakuk River is also a highway for one of the region's major salmon runs." "A fully electric seaplane has made its first flight over the mouth of the Fraser River near Vancouver, British Columbia. The maiden flight represents a milestone in the long process of reducing the aviation industry's emissions, noise and costs by electrifying short-to-medium distance commercial flying. "Bill would give Alaskans an advisory role in Arctic shipping - [T]he "Arctic Shipping Federal Advisory Committee Act." ... establishes a 15-member committee to advise Congress and the Transportation secretary. Murkowski says the committee will give Alaskans and coastal residents a voice as the sea ice recedes and traffic increases. Whalers, walrus hunters and fishermen are already crossing paths with more commercial ships, the senator says... The governors of Alaska and Washington can each nominate one member to the committee. One seat is reserved for an Alaska tribal member. There is also a seat to represent subsistence users and one for coastal communities.

The bill cleared the Commerce Committee Wednesday. Its next stop is the Senate floor." [from APM 12-11-19](#)

-- "Hello this is The **Asymmetric Moose**, Rob Mulford with picks of the week of December 15, 2019. This week I'd like to chat a little about Responsible Mineral Sourcing.

According to forecasts published in a report prepared for Earthworks by Institute for Sustainable Futures, University of Technology, Sydney, Australia, titled "**Responsible Mineral Sourcing for Renewable Energy**"; if the world transitions to 100% renewable energy by 2050, the total demand for Lithium will reach 280 percent of global reserves (the estimated

amount of a mineral that can be economically mined under current conditions) and 85% of global resources (the total known amount of a mineral for which extraction may be potentially be feasible).

Over half of the worlds Lithium reserves are found in brine wells below the surface of the Andean Salt Flats of Argentina, Bolivia, and Chile. Mining the mineral there essentially equals mining water. Chile's Salar de Atacama is one of the most arid places on earth. Mining there is now extracting 2000 more liters of water per second than is replenished. Catastrophe looms over the areas wild life and indigenous peoples.

Last month Bolivia's Indigenous President Evo Morales was deposed by what only be classified as a coup de tat, led by rightwing Christian fascists. This came about a week after Morales canceled an agreement with Germany's ACI Systems Alemania (ACISA) to mine the Bolivian Salar. Among other clients, ACISA provides batteries to Tesla. Tesla's stock rose the Monday after the coup.

The US military consumes more hydrocarbons than most countries. Are we going to allow this situation to transform analogously into a renewable energy future? Where is the justice in that.

The US house this past week, 377 to 48, approved a \$738B payout to the same racket, the world's largest protection racket, the US DoD. "Every gun that is made, every warship launched, every rocket fired, signifies in the final sense a theft from those who hunger and are not fed, those who are cold and are not clothed", and those who are dying of thirst due to the theft of their precious water. I repeat, where is the justice.

The racket is all about domination, theft, and murder. It is not, never was, and never can be green.

We liberated Birkenau. I still see every face. I didn't fight the Nazis to allow them in this place. John McCutcheon sings, "*The Machine*". [ISRC # USEPH1700005]

The next tune is about another victim of irresponsible mineral sourcing. Again I'll play a John McCutcheon, this time singing "*The Ludlow Massacre*." [ISRC # USEPH1100012]."
