With the International Criminal Court investigating the actions of all parties to the war in Afghanistan and potentially investigating Israel's actions in Palestine, in June 2020 U.S. President Donald Trump issued an executive order authorizing the punishment of any individuals involved in or in any way assisting such court proceedings. "Hello this is Rob Mulford, the Asymmetric Moose, with picks for the week of February 7th, 2021:

This past Wednesday, February 3rd , the world lost another powerful poetic voice for human rights and dignity to the Corona Virus.

Anne Feeney took early inspiration from her grandfather, William Patrick Feeney, a mine worker's union organizer and a violinist. In 1967, while still in high school, she bought a Martin guitar and did her first public performance, singing Phil Ochs songs, at an anti-war rally in 1969. She was arrested at the Republican National Convention in Miami in 1972 protesting the nomination of President Richard Nixon. Also in 1972, while at the University of

Pittsburgh, she co-founded Pittsburgh Action Against Rape. She graduated from the Pitt School of Law in 1978, worked 12 years as a trial attorney and served as president of the Pittsburgh Musician's Union. She also was president of a NOW chapter and served on the board of the Thomas Merton Center.

Anne carried the red card certifying her membership in the Industrial Workers of the World, the Wobblies, as well as a business card that read: "Performer, Producer, Hellraiser". Next she sings a tune, of hers, that has inspired me onward on more than a few occasions, **Have You been to Jail for Justice. Anne Feeney... présent!**
