The Bridge – Encampment Outreach:... connected with approximately 50 people experiencing unsheltered homelessness in the Fairbanks area. More importantly, many people signed up for additional services!

This site was created by a former Alyeska engineer after being alerted to symptoms and medical outcomes of EMF exposure. Based on tests he conducted, the summit of Ester Dome is a zone of extremely high EMF. The source is the telcomm towers that dominate the summit. In rough terms, the summit topology is unfit for human habitation. Passing through the area or incidentally visiting it incurs exposure. EMF damage is cumulative. "Fairbanks Community COVID-19 Vaccination Signup Tips

As a general guideline, new appointments for vaccination will appear on the website covidvax.alaska.gov each Thursday at noon (assuming there is additional vaccine available). Appointments may also show up on the website at other times. If new appointments are appearing for a Carlson Center Mass Vaccination Clinic at different times/dates, we will do our best to get the message out to the entire community. Other vaccine providers may also make new appointments available at the website at different times, so it is best to check back frequently, covidvax.alaska.gov, for new appointments. You can also check directly with other vaccination clinics in town to see if there are any new appointments available.

Alaskans currently eligible to receive the vaccine can make an appointment in 2 ways:

By phone (This may be the easiest option, especially when the website goes down, which happens occasionally)
