Community Supported Agriculture is a farm or association of multiple farms that offers regular (usually weekly) deliveries of locally-grown farm products during one or more harvest seasons on a subscription or membership basis. You have access to a selected share or range of farm products offered by a single local farm or group of farmers based on partial or total advance payment of a subscription or membership fee. On many farms you are welcome to participate in the life of the farm - through workdays and celebrations.

"Hello from Rob Mulford, the Asymmetric Moose, for the week of April 25th:

*In our last Asymmetric Moose Inquest Into the Operations of the War Racket we heard testimony from warfighters both enlisted and commissioned who spoke of the dishonest predatory methods used to recruit cannon fodder for the military industrial complex. In the previous episode we heard from **I. M. Ironman**, Major General Ross Coffman. Discussing plans to keep half of the world's population in line by invading **roughly 27 million square kilometers of the Indo-Pacific region** with "optionally manned" armored vehicles. This week we'll examine the Army's plans to incorporate aviation into that nefarious endeavor.*

Members of the jury - The April 23rd, 2021 edition of Fort Wainwright's Alaska Post, in an article by Devon Suits, of the Army News Service, titled "Army aviation undergoing changes to meet Multiple Domain Operations requirements", states "Army aviation leaders are evaluating a series of fundamental changes to collective training, leadership, and doctrine to ensure the enduring fleet and future vertical lift platforms remain competitive within a multi-domain operational environment."

Asymmetric Moose - I call to the witness stand, Army Major Gen. David Francis... General, what is your position within the US Military enterprise.

General Francis – "I am the commander of the Army Aviation Center of Excellence."

Asymmetric Moose – "General, please explain the significance of the statement that I just read."

General Francis - "Army aviation serves as the aerial maneuver arm of combined arms maneuver in support of the ground force commanders. We are in the process of transforming Army aviation from fighting counterinsurgency operations to a focus on future peer threats. Continued modernization is critical to achieve necessary transformational capabilities as the Army prepares for large-scale combat operations. As the Multi-Domain-Operations concept shifts [to the changes in] doctrine, and Future Vertical Liftoff platforms and other new aviation capabilities take off, the Army's aerial-maneuver element will need to evolve. Army aviation is currently transforming organizations to move beyond a modular brigade-centric operations approach to support division and corps-sized operations. This change will also prepare the Army for rapid integration of Future Vertical Liftoff capabilities as they come online."

Asymmetric Moose – "General the paper goes on to say: "Adjustments to training are also being addressed to incorporate how aviators and maintainers will fight or support operations across all domains -- land, maritime, air, space, and cyberspace." Please explain."

General Francis - "We are changing the way we address emergency procedures at low altitudes, and we are training our aviation forces to fly low once

again. Pilots proficient at flying in terrain-height altitudes can stay below a radar threat and "survive, fight and win" on a future battlefield."

Asymmetric Moose – "Members of the jury, please keep in mind, the operative word **doctrine**."

Asymmetric Moose – "General the paper states: "Another aspect of training includes the proper on-boarding of the Future Attack Reconnaissance Aircraft and Future Long-Range Assault Aircraft. As the Army introduces its newest aerial capability, collective training will be necessary to ensure mission readiness as more Future Vertical Liftoff units materialize across the force." Explain please."

General Francis – "Leadership development is also under revision as the Army shifts its focus to large-scale operations. Personnel will need to learn how to operate and sustain aviation capabilities throughout a dispersed environment and converge effects when called upon by ground force commanders. This is going to cause leaders to think differently."

Asymmetric Moose – "Thank you, General. You may step down. I now call to the witness stand, Maj. Gen. Walter Rugen... General Rugen, please state, for the jury, your position within the US Military enterprise."

General Rugen – "I am the Future Vertical Liftoff Cross-Functional Team director."

Asymmetric Moose – "This paper that we've been discussing describes an event coming up in May called EDGE 21. What is that all about?"

General Rugen – "Army aviation will also move forward with its first Experimental Demonstration Gateway Exercise 2021 at Dugway Proving Ground, Utah. EDGE 21 [which stands for Experimental Demonstration Gateway Exercise] will use aviation, network, and space capabilities to advance combined joint all-domain command and control efforts, or CJADC2, across the lower-tier air domain. We are going to take our high-fidelity modeling, these 100,000 engineered runs that we've done in a physics-based modeling with the Future Attack Reconnaissance Aircraft ecosystem, and fight that in a scenario where we use joint long-range fires. The exercise will show the progression of sensor-to-shooter systems, as the Army looks to close joint kill chains in an agile and effective manner. EDGE 21 will also include an electronic warfare element to create a realistic Multi-Domain Operations scenario against an Integrated Visual Augmentation System-enabled aircraft. [The new exercise will apply space, aviation and network capabilities to how the Army and the joint force would fight in the Indo-Pacific theater, based on high-fidelity modeling the service has used to show the efficacy of its capabilities in Indo-Pacific Command's area of operation.]"

Asymmetric Moose – "Thank you, General. Please stand down. Members of the Jury, while reading an autumn 1915 edition of the Baltimore Sun, President Woodrow became enraged by an article reporting that the General Staff was preparing plans for the eventuality of war with Germany. This reportedly so shocked the President that he became pale. Summoning Secretary of War Breckinridge to his office, he asked, "Is this true." After Breckinridge replied that he did not know, Wilson ordered him to investigate. If the story proved to be accurate the Secretary was to fire every officer of the General Staff and order them out of Washington."

Early in the year 2000 a senior researcher working at the Naval War College, named Thomas P.M. Barnett was recruited by the Wall Street Bond Firm Cantor Fitzgerald to study how neoliberal globalism was remaking the global security environment. Out of that research came a system of global Rule Sets. You may hear that term bandied about in the media today. After the September 11, 2001 attacks, Barnett was hired by Rear Admiral Arthur Cebrowski to help him lead the DoD's Office of Force Transformation. Out of that work came a change in Doctrine that focused the military's Leviathan power on nongovernment actors, aka civilians, in order to advance the spread of that aforementioned neoliberal globalist agenda. This doctrine under the name Network Centric Warfare became the operational impetus behind every war and military operation since. I ask you to consider its efficacy and

the injury that has befallen humanity in its wake. Maybe it's time for a president to take the stand that Woodrow Wilson did in 1915 and put these computer gaming warmongers out of business.

I know I played this back in December, but it's topical, dang it. Phil Ochs sings What Are You Fighting For.
